

### INFORMATION ABOUT NEW RECTORY



As you know, Fr. Ed upon his arrival one year ago was living in a townhouse in Newtown as the rectory on the church property is uninhabitable. In order to provide the pastor with a suitable place to

live, the Eparchy of Passaic has purchased a home in Cobalt Ridge. The purchase price of \$269,000 and improvements and appliance purchases of approximately \$20,000 are considered to be a loan to OLPH. So, in the near future we will be responsible for a mortgage payment to the Eparchy. The monthly amount is yet to be determined. Please know that the bishop has been extremely generous to the parish family of OLPH in covering the cost of the pastor's rent (\$24,000.00) and the purchase of furniture (\$11,000.00) during this first year. It is now time for the parish family of OLPH to step up and fully cover the cost of housing for the pastor. If you have and questions about the new rectory, please see Fr. Ed. There will be an open house in September.

### 26th Annual Ukrainian Folk Festival

Exciting, spectacular, dazzling, breathtaking, exhilarating, spirited, soulful, enchanting, captivating, and intriguing – modest words which describe but by no means capture the full essence of Ukrainian folk art, song, music, and dance. From the rich color and deep symbolism of the delicate “pysanka” (Ukrainian Easter Egg) to the thunderous rhythm and power of “HOPAK” – the world's most exciting ethnic dance - and every brilliant “Kolomyika” (polka) and soulful folk song in between, experience the 26th Annual Ukrainian Folk Festival.



**THE TRANSFIGURATION OF CHRIST** is one of the central events recorded in the gospels. Immediately after the Lord was recognized by his apostles as “the Christ [Messiah], the Son of the Living God,” he told them that “he must go up to Jerusalem and suffer many things ... and be killed and on the third day be



raised” (Mt 16). The announcement of Christ's approaching passion and death was met with indignation by the disciples. And then, after rebuking them, the Lord took Peter, James, and John “up to a high mountain” -- by tradition **Mount Tabor** -- and was “transfigured before them.” ... and his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as snow and behold, there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. And

Peter said to Jesus, “Lord, it is well that we are here; if you wish I will make three booths here, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah.” He was still speaking when lo, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice from the cloud said, “This is my Beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.” When the disciples heard this, they fell on their faces with awe. In the Transfiguration, the apostles see the glory of the Kingdom of God present in majesty in the person of Christ They see that in him, indeed, all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell,” that “in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily” (Col 1:19, 2:9). They see this before the crucifixion so that in the resurrection they might know who it is who has suffered for them, and what it is that this one, who is God, has prepared for those who love him. This is what the Church celebrates in the feast of the Transfiguration.
