Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

For the Jewish people, the cross was a tree of shame and for the Romans it was an instrument of execution. But for the Christians the cross became the symbol of victory and salvation, an object of special veneration. The Primitive Church provides us with sufficient and definite evidence of the veneration of the Holy Cross. With the granting of peace by Constantine I and the discovery of the true Cross of Christ (about A.D. 326), the veneration of the Holy Cross became public and very popular.
